St. Paul Pre-K: Week #4 Continuous Learning Packet. These items will be in your packet for the week of April 27, 2020. I do not need anything returned to me. If the activity is too hard for your student, please feel free to do it with them. Remember, your child is 4 and shouldn't sit for long periods of time.

Alphabet Knowledge: The Letter Ww. Walter Walrus is our Letterland Character for the letter W. Walter Walrus' action is to flick both hands up and away as if splashing water with your walrus flippers. To make the /W/ sound, hold your lips as if you are going to whistle and blow the sound through your rounded lips. Formation of a W begins at the top line, draw diagonal down slightly right, draw diagonal from the bottom line up slightly right to the top line, diagonal down slightly right, and diagonal back to the top line up and slightly right again. These motions are all done without picking up your pencil.

The Letter Vv. Vicky Violet is our other Letterland Character for the letter V. Vicky Violet's action is to hold your hands together in v-shape at your wrists. To create the /v/ sound, place your lower lip under your two front teeth and make the /v/ sound. The formation of the letter V is to begin at the top line, go to the bottom line slightly diagonal down to the right, then return slightly diagonal right and up to the top line without picking your pencil up.

Fun with our letters of the week. Packet "w is for weather." Letter Ww review, trace the weather, complete the patterns, find the one that does not belong, shadow matching, scissor practice, and draw a picture of what you would wear on a sunny and rainy day.

Packet "v is for violin." Letter Vv review, scissor practice, what starts with the letter v, color the violinbrown, order violins from smallest to biggest, and match the capital/lowercase by color.

Beginning sounding: I have 2 games that will help with letter sounding skills.

- 1) Summer Alphabet Clip Cards. Find the letter the picture begins with and point or use your clothespins to clip.
- 2) Sounding out words. You may cut out the letters and use them to spell the 3 letter words (CVC-Consonant/Vowel/Consonant) words.

Math: Number 19- Trace, color and count.

Ladybug Counting Game- Numbers 1-20. Count the spots on the ladybugs and point to the correct number or your child may use clothespins to clip the number. If you don't write on them, they may be used more than once.

Science- Names for father, mother, and baby animals.
